INTRODUCTION

This document provides basic information and contact information related to HIV prevention projects funded by the Division of HIV/AIDS Services (DHAS), New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services (NJDHSS), as well as important information about the guiding principles upon which these activities are grounded. An updated edition of this document can be found at the following Internet address: <http://www.state.nj.us/health/aids/grantees.pdf>

Forty-four community-based projects provide HIV prevention services with funding from the DHAS, NJDHSS. Among these projects, 21 target people living with HIV infection and 28 target urban, African American and Latino men, women or youth who are at risk of acquiring or transmitting HIV either sexually or by injection drug use. All projects are located in urban, suburban, and rural areas heavily impacted by the HIV epidemic, including 17 cities and the New Jersey counties heavily impacted by HIV infection. Descriptions of these projects are listed by county in this directory.

Several larger-scale and statewide initiatives provide intensive, specialized HIV prevention and risk reduction services to specific target populations, including:

- A) Drop-in center initiatives located in Newark, Jersey City, Paterson, Camden and Atlantic City (see page 2);
- B) The statewide New Jersey Teen Prevention Education Program activities located in over 53 high schools and community-based organizations (see page 7);
- C) The statewide Project FAITH HIV prevention initiatives located in churches throughout the Garden State (see page 5); and
- D) HIV prevention outreach to migrant farm populations located in Southern New Jersey (see page 31). These initiatives frequently involve the participation of several of the 44 community-based projects.

HIV Prevention and Risk Reduction Activities Funded by the DHAS

Effective HIV prevention and risk reduction activities are grounded in several basic standards.

First, HIV prevention and risk reduction activities should address the prevention and risk reduction needs of *specific* populations at risk for HIV infection due to their sexual and drug-related high risk behavior. In New Jersey the *specific* populations targeted by HIV prevention activities funded by the DHAS include the following:

- Individuals living with HIV infection;
- Injection drug users (IDU);
- Men who have sex with men (MSM);
- Women at risk through heterosexual transmission;
- Non-injection substance users;
- Youth not yet patterned; and
- Heterosexual men whose only risk is heterosexual contact.

Second, HIV prevention and risk reduction activities should be culturally and linguistically appropriate for the targeted populations. All HIV prevention projects funded by the DHAS are expected to comply with the *New Jersey Culturally and Linguistically Appropriate Services Standards (NJCLAS) for HIV/AIDS Services* published by the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services. Third, along with focusing on accurate information about HIV risk and prevention, activities should focus on enhancing the skills and capacities needed to implement personal risk reduction strategies. Research has shown that to reduce high risk sexual or drug-related behavior, people may need multiple and varied interventions that aim at both enhancing their risk reductions skills, and addressing their attitudes related to HIV risk and their capacity for making the kind of changes that may be beneficial to their health. They may need one or more of the following:

- **Risk education** (accurate information about HIV and HIV prevention and risk-reduction strategies)
- **Risk reduction skills enhancement** (communication, negotiation, decision making, problem solving, and safer sex and drug skills)
- **Personalization of risk or threat**
- **Support for HIV risk reduction efforts**
- **Personal self-efficacy** (self-confidence)
- **The personal desire to change.**

Finally, DHAS-funded HIV prevention and risk reduction activities are monitored for quality assurance, and fidelity to their intended funded objectives. Comprehensive site visits are conducted at each project, twice annually, in an effort to ensure quality. Additionally, funded projects are required to submit monthly progress reports on funded activities. Technical assistance is provided in the areas of intervention, program, staff, and curriculum development with training, workshops, and conferences designed to meet technical assistance needs offered

throughout the year. DHAS staff provides extensive training and technical assistance to HIV prevention projects in both programmatic and fiscal. Training and technical assistance sessions are announced in the PAE unit's annual training announcement or through the distribution of workshop or conference announcement flyers. All funded HIV prevention activities are expected to comply with the implementation standards outlined in the *HIV Prevention Interventions Manual* published by the Prevention and Education Unit of the DHAS.

HIV prevention projects funded by the NJDHSS assist those at risk for HIV or who are HIV positive through the following activities:

Individual Level Outreach (ILO)

The first place where DHAS-funded HIV prevention projects meet their targeted high risk populations is in the street or community. Outreach activities have several goals: First, they work to channel people at risk for HIV into HIV testing, and where appropriate, to HIV treatment and/or partner notification services. Second, they empower culturally-competent outreach workers to provide HIV prevention information, risk reduction counseling, referrals, and treatment options to populations at high-risk for HIV infection. Third, they provide community-based agencies with opportunities for developing a helping presence in the community, enabling them to foster relationships of trust that are the basis for providing HIV information, prevention services, and referrals to reduce the risk of HIV infection and transmission. Finally, outreach activities provide facilitated referrals of high-risk individuals into other HIV prevention services, such as, individual and group level HIV prevention services and referrals for STD and hepatitis prevention and treatment services.

Interventions Delivered to Individuals (IDI)

IDIs are sessions that focus on health education and risk reduction with regards to HIV and other infectious diseases (including STD's and hepatitis A, B and C). While these sessions focus on the same informational and skills enhancement activities as multi-session group-level interventions, their scope is limited. In many instances these interventions involve referral to HIV testing and treatment services or other HIV prevention services.

Interventions Delivered to Groups (IDG)

IDGs provide the kind of group reinforcement of change efforts that individual-level interventions cannot. DHAS-funded HIV prevention projects are required to use only those curricula or interventions that have been researched and proven effective. These interventions, which are part of the Diffusion of Effective Behavioral Interventions (DEBI) campaign of the Division of HIV/AIDS Prevention at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, are products of years of research conducted at many of our nation's universities and HIV/AIDS research centers. They have been proven to reduce specific high-risk behaviors among the populations that they target. The following EBI interventions are utilized by HIV prevention projects funded by the DHAS:

Comprehensive Risk Counseling Services (CRCS)

CRCS is an intensive, individual-level, multi-session counseling intervention that is intended to provide persons at increased risk for HIV infection with the information and skills they need to implement personal risk-reduction strategies. Like HE/RR multi-sessions, CRCS counseling sessions promote the enhancement of risk-reduction skills and the development of personal HIV risk recognition and self-esteem. CRCS sessions go beyond the scope of HE/RR sessions by assisting high-risk individuals to develop personalized prevention plans and helping them to manage the life challenges that may influence high-risk behaviors.

Community-level Interventions (CLI)

Community-level Interventions target communities and/or social networks. The goal of these interventions is to impact the way that communities relate to HIV risk and risk-reduction strategies. Utilizing community-focused EBI interventions enables HIV prevention projects to provide CLIs to clearly-defined social networks in an effort to promote HIV prevention and risk reduction strategies. The following community-level EBI intervention is utilized by projects funded by the DHAS.

NEW JERSEY AIDS/STD HOTLINE 1-800-624-2377

Staffed by full-time nurses, pharmacists and physicians, the New Jersey AIDS/STD Hotline is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to provide information and referrals regarding the prevention and treatment of HIV/AIDS, viral hepatitis (hepatitis A, B and C) and sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) through its toll-free telephone service (1-800-624-2377). While many of the information specialists are bilingual (English/Spanish), the Hotline also contracts with a translation service to help individuals with their questions in more than 100 languages. The New Jersey AIDS/STD Hotline also has telecommunication capability for the hearing impaired through TTY/TDD (973-926-8008).

The New Jersey AIDS/STD Hotline provides callers with information on a wide spectrum of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis and STD issues. With its computer reference system and professional pharmacy back-up, drug information services are available around the clock. Since its inception in 1988, the New Jersey AIDS/STD Hotline has responded to more than 150,000 inquiries, regularly reporting aggregate data of its call characteristics.

Questions frequently asked by callers involve the location of counseling and testing centers, whether a particular behavior has placed them at-risk for HIV, how to reduce their risks, and questions on financial assistance with medications. Information specialists who staff the New Jersey AIDS/STD Hotline are prepared to do the following: Refer callers to the closest location for HIV counseling and testing, resources for hepatitis vaccination (hepatitis A and B) and for testing and treatment (chronic hepatitis B and hepatitis C) or local STD treatment sites; answer questions about treatment medications; provide resources for financial assistance; refer callers to medical specialists, if needed; and refer callers to HIV prevention projects and/or reassure the “worried well.”

DROP-IN CENTER INITIATIVE

In order to reduce the number of new HIV infections and offer prevention services to people already living with HIV, the Division of HIV/AIDS Services provides several agencies with additional funding to maintain drop-in centers that provide specialized HIV prevention services to people who engage in high-risk drug and sexual behavior. The drop-in centers are located in Atlantic City, Camden, Jersey City, Newark and Paterson at locations that provide easy access for people who exchange sex for resources, inject drugs, are homeless or a member of a transient population, or are high-risk gay, lesbian, transgender or questioning (GLBT) youth (Paterson drop-in center).

These drop-in centers provide the following HIV prevention services: Street outreach to provide HIV prevention information, resources, referral and support to targeted high-risk populations; Individual-level HIV prevention interventions, e.g., risk reduction counseling, condom and communication skills-building education for clients who access the drop-in center for support; One-on-one Comprehensive Risk Counseling Services sessions for high-risk individuals and/or people with HIV, who are referred either through the drop-in center or street outreach; and HIV counseling and testing services for clients whose HIV status is unknown.

Both prevention and care funds are used to support these drop-in centers. Consequently, they represent a real collaboration between HIV prevention and treatment staff on both the State and agency levels. Drop-in centers that were previously dedicated exclusively to providing either HIV treatment or prevention services now offer a wide variety of HIV prevention and treatment services under one roof. Meanwhile, HIV positive clients no longer need be referred off-site for HIV prevention services, and newly identified HIV positive clients can receive immediate on-site care. Additionally, by integrating HIV prevention and care services, drop-in centers are able to provide a full range of HIV services in a cost-efficient manner.

HEALTH INCENTIVE PROGRAM FOR WOMEN (HIP4W)

The HIP4W Program was designed to reduce the transmission of HIV among the female sex partners of at-risk men. This program is part of the DHAS's efforts to reduce the transmission of HIV among women. Women at risk for HIV by means of sexual transmission and/or previous injection drug use receive the following services: HIV testing, on-going, in-depth harm and risk reduction counseling, and life skills enhancement—all designed to bring about and sustain behavior change. HIP4W uses financial and non-financial incentives, i.e., clothing, childcare, non-perishable food, transportation, personal care items, and vocational, pastoral, and educational counseling, to improve overall life conditions and to encourage client participation.

Women who have had sexual relations with men who are at risk for HIV infection within the past three months are eligible for the program (men-at-risk include injection drug users or IDUs, heroin/cocaine users, men who have been diagnosed as having or being treated for a sexually transmitted disease, and men who are already HIV infected). To further qualify, clients must not be current drug injectors or have been within the past six months. Participants in the 180-day (six-month) program receive training on HIV prevention and treatment, behavior empowerment skills building and job readiness, while receiving information on HIV and drug use, risky sexual behaviors, STDs, relationships, stress and nutrition. Support systems are also in place to assist clients in their behavior change choices.

Project FAITH is a statewide, community-level HIV/AIDS education and prevention program that targets faith leaders in various houses of worship or non-traditional settings throughout New Jersey. Their primary goal is to provide the following services:

- Rapid testing events within houses of faith
- SISTA (Sisters Informing Sisters on Topics About AIDS)

Project FAITH also provides leadership to faith communities by coordinating the following campaigns in New Jersey:

- National Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day – February
- The Black Church Week of Prayer for the Healing of AIDS – March

Project Rebuild (Family-To-Family)

Project Rebuild administers the “Family-To-Family” program, an initiative designed to assist families in building stronger ties with one another to help face many of life’s challenges. The Family-to-Family program--through its Family Home Evening Sessions—instructs families on how to use “family time” in a productive way. During each session, lessons and exercises are presented that allow participants to share their experiences, wants, needs, dislikes, and problems with one another. By fostering a dialogue between family members, difficult subject matter, such as the issue of HIV/AIDS, can be confronted in a loving, encouraging, and inviting atmosphere. Through Family-To-Family, Project Rebuild disseminates HIV/AIDS education and counseling and testing information to their targeted community through Family Home Evening Sessions. HIV prevention materials are presented in an indirect and private manner so as to encourage HIV prevention practices--despite the cultural and social stigma surrounding the disease.

The Family-To-Family program is available at select houses of worship and community based organizations throughout New Jersey.

NEW JERSEY TEEN PREVENTION EDUCATION PROJECT

The New Jersey Teen Prevention Education Program (Teen PEP) is a school-based initiative to promote sexual health among New Jersey high school students. Teen PEP is sponsored by the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services in collaboration with the Princeton Center for Leadership Training (PCLT) and Princeton HiTOPS, Inc. (Health Interested Teens' Own Program on Sexuality). The program is based on the peer-to-peer education model developed by the Princeton Center and the nationally recognized sexual health curriculum developed by Princeton HiTOPS, Inc. The collaborating partners work with interested high schools across New Jersey to institute an alternative or elective sexual health course that is consistent with the core curriculum content standards developed by the New Jersey Department of Education. NEW JERSEY WOMEN AND AIDS NETWORK (NJWAN)

The mission of NJWAN is to:

- Reduce the spread of HIV infection in women;
- Empower women living with HIV/AIDS to better access quality care and treatment;
- Educate service providers to the special needs of women living with HIV; and
- Advocate for public policies that are sensitive to the needs of women infected and affected by the HIV pandemic.

NJWAN reaches individuals, organizations, and communities through:

- A toll-free warm line (800-747-1108) providing information relevant to women and HIV;
- A quarterly newsletter;
- Numerous group-level health education/risk reduction presentations and multi sessions; and

The following health education/risk reduction programs are available on a statewide basis, particularly at locations in Camden, Trenton, Paterson, and New Brunswick:

Sister RISE, a multi-session group-level health education program designed to increase knowledge and improve attitudes related to adherence and compliance to HIV treatment regimens. The goal is to encourage positive health behaviors among women living with HIV/AIDS. Consequently, participants are encouraged to bring partners, family, or friends to these interactive learning sessions.

PATIENT INCENTIVE PROGRAM (PIP)

The PIP program was designed to reduce the risk of HIV transmission among injection drug users (IDUs) by providing non-financial incentives and free, on-demand drug treatment that incorporates HIV counseling and testing, referral to an HIV Early Intervention Program (EIP), harm reduction, case management, and opioid addiction treatment. PIP is intended to provide equitable access to care regardless of the applicant's ability to pay, assessment prompting the most appropriate level of care placement, and the highest standards in methadone treatment.

Traditional outreach is conducted at the following three PIP sites: John Brooks Recovery Program (formerly The Institute for Human Development), The Lennard Center (TLC), and New Horizon Treatment Center (NHTC). Enhanced recruitment efforts are being implemented in all four PIP sites through the use of Social Networks Strategy, a CDC recommended component that is intended to capitalize on the social, sexual and drug using social networks of PIP clients.

PREVENTION WITH POSITIVES (PWP) INITIATIVES

People living with HIV (PLWH) have a critical role in preventing and/or reducing the number of new HIV infections. Unfortunately, the HIV prevention needs of HIV-infected individuals are frequently overlooked. The simple reality is:

- The number of PLWH continues to increase because PLWH are living longer and better lives as a result of advances in HIV/AIDS treatment
- With more PLWH living longer, many people become complacent about reducing HIV risk behaviors.
- The number of new drug resistant HIV infections due to re-infection or non-compliance with HIV treatment protocols continues to increase.
- HIV prevention strategies designed for HIV negative individuals frequently have little relevance to the high-risk behavior of HIV positive people.
- The daily life stressors faced by PLWH frequently lead to increased incidence of high risk sexual and drug behavior and to non-compliance to HIV treatment protocols.
- By promoting adherence to HIV treatment protocols and HIV risk reduction strategies among PLWH, we assist in reducing the number of new HIV infections.

The effort to prevent further HIV infection among HIV-infected individuals is an essential component of New Jersey's HIV prevention efforts. While 21 projects are funded specifically to provide HIV prevention services to PLWH, all projects funded by the DHAS make prevention efforts directed to this population a priority. The goal of PWP initiatives is to reduce the number of new HIV infections by assisting PLWH to both manage their adherence to HIV treatment protocols and to reduce their high risk sexual and drug behavior. This is achieved, first and foremost, through aggressive outreach efforts that assist at-risk individuals in obtaining HIV testing to determine their HIV status. Those who discover that they are HIV-infected are counseled to receive medical treatment, partner notification services, and specific prevention interventions such as individual-level and/or group level health education/risk reduction (HE/RR) counseling and education sessions, HIV comprehensive risk counseling services (CRCS) and support groups.

Integrating Prevention into HIV Treatment Services

It is essential that traditional barriers that have kept HIV treatment efforts separate from prevention activities be removed and that services be made client-centered and easy to access at one single site. PWP initiatives integrate HIV prevention activities into already established HIV treatment services and specifically seek out HIV positive individuals for HIV prevention activities (Each One Reach One). The Drop-in Center Initiative [see page 3] supports the PWP initiative in that they serve as outreach facilities for injection drug users, the homeless, sex workers and other high-risk individuals who can obtain care and prevention services at the same location.

The goal of this arm of the PWP initiative is to identify and provide HIV prevention services to HIV-infected individuals who receive HIV treatment at Early Intervention Program (EIP) sites funded by the Division of HIV/AIDS Services (DHAS). This is achieved through a variety of interventions, among which are aggressive community outreach, individual-level health education/risk reduction (HE/RR) counseling and education sessions, CRCS and support groups.
